# NOTES ON MILITARY LAW.

#### CHAPTER I.

#### INTRODUCTORY.

The Laws of Great Britain and Ireland, as applicable to every subject, are derived from two separate sources:—

- Statute Law—Passed by Parliament and sanctioned by the Crown.
- Common Law—A Judge-made Law, derived from precedents formed by the decisions of celebrated Judges, which are sure to be followed, and become as binding as Statute Laws.

Statute Law is gradually replacing Common Law, but it is a slow process.

Military Law has no permanent Statute, and reference to precedent is by no means frequent. Still there exists the Written Law, the Army Discipline and Regulation Act, and the Unwritten Law recognized in the former Articles of War under the term "Custom of War," which was analogous to the Common Law. The Act which is now in force states (under the Rules of Procedure for C.M.) that "where any matter or thing is not provided for, the
