THE WHATELY MEMORIAL PRIZE.

On the 13th of May, 1871, the Committee of the Whately Memorial Fund transferred to the Board of Trinity College, Dublin, a sum of £411, 7s. 1d. New Three per Cents., which remained after meeting the expenses connected with the erection of the monument to Archbishop Whately in St. Fatrick's Cathedral. The gift was accompanied by a statement, that it was the wish of the subscribers that the dividends on the stock should be allowed to accumulate, and that the sum accrued at the end of each period of five years should be awarded as a premium, to be called the Whately Prize: On the 21st of June, 1886, it was resolved by the Board;—

- That the prize be in future awarded to the author of the best essay on a specified economic subject.
- That graduates of all chartered universities of the United Kingdom be aligible as candidates.
- That the subject be announced at least one year previous to the date for sending in the essays.
- 4.—That the subject for 1887 shall be "A History and Criticism of the Various Theories of Wages."
