



THE frontispiece of this work, so pleasingly executed by Mr. McFADDEN, after an original drawing¹ made by Dr. WILLIAM BORLASE, the Cornish historian and the Author's great-great-grandfather, in the middle of the last century, represents a monument second to none in the county of Cornwall for the interest it possesses for the archæologist.

It occupies a central position on the apex of the last hill in England, is a mark well known to mariners, and on nearer approach is seen to consist of a rough, bare pile of stones, risingover the granite outcrop which flanks the hill and the scanty heather which
