PREFATORY NOTE

T has long been felt by some of those whose business it is to teach "Bible classes,"-whether in the church, the school, or the family,-that their work might be greatly assisted could they direct their pupils to suitable text-books. But although in every other branch of education there is an abundance of manuals suitable for primary and secondary instruction, and prepared by men who are recognised authorities in their respective departments, the immense stores of Biblical learning which have now been accumulated have not been made accessible to the young scholar.
