NOTE.

THE Public Latin School of Boston enjoys the distinction of being the oldest existing school within the bounds of the United States. It was founded in the spring of 1635, thus antedating Harvard College, and has been in continuous existence ever since, with the interruption of a few months during the siege of Boston, 1775-1776. The Association, composed of its past members and teachers, celebrated the two hundred and fiftieth anniversary by a festival in the building occupied by the school, on the evening of April 23, 1885, when the address and poem which follow were given. The appendix to this volume completes the record of the occasion.
