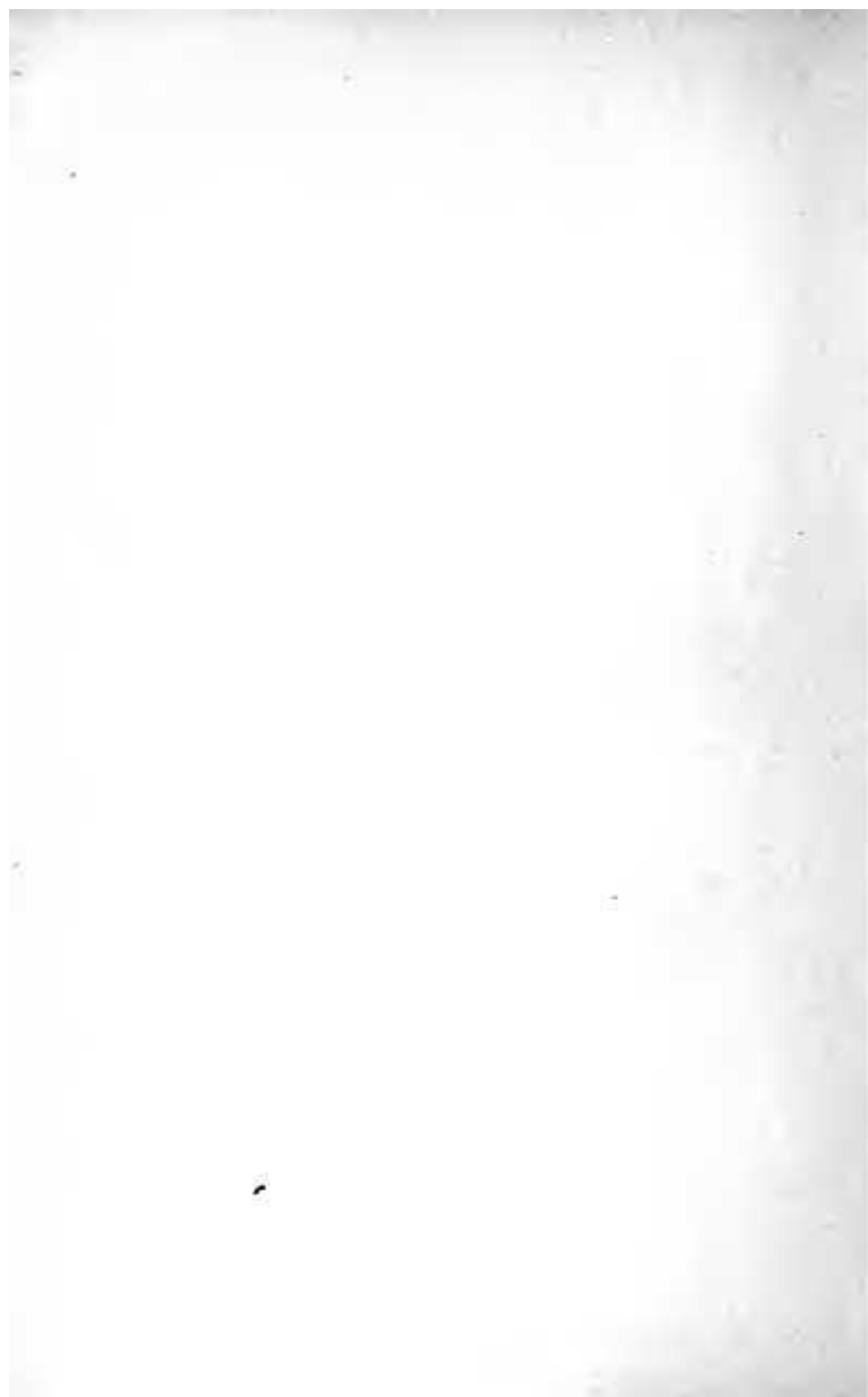
*My dear George:*
