Hitherto it has been necessary to consult various works, some of which are not readily accessible, in order to obtain the requisite information. To obviate this difficulty, the compiler has been induced to prepare this little book; and she trusts that her efforts, the result of much care and practical experience, may prove successful in abridging the labour of the teacher, and in rendering study more agreeable and beneficial to the pupil.
