

Mr. Whitelock: I move that the Secretary cast the ballot of the Association for the admission of the gentlemen whose names have just been read.

The motion was seconded, and, on the question being put, was adopted, and the Secretary accordingly cast the ballot of the Association for the gentlemen favorably reported by the Committee on Admissions and they were declared duly elected members of the Association.

Mr. Hinkley: The Constitution provides that no one can join the Association unless a member of his Local Bar Association. There is now in the Constitution an exception in favor of the Judges of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City, but by an oversight this exception does not cover the case of Federal Judges nor the Baltimore City Judge of the Court of Appeals; the Committee, therefore, recommends that Article IV of the Constitution be amended by striking out the words: "Members of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City" and inserting in lieu thereof, "State or Federal Judges."

The motion was seconded, and, on the question being put, it was decided in the affirmative and the amendment adopted.
