THIS volume is little more than a re-issue of that published in 1869; the Ballads and Poems were selected by the lamented Author, and received his latest corrections. They are the pieces by which his reputation as a Poet will chiefly live in the future, and are mainly connected with the "Tamar Side," the land with which he was, when living, so closely identified, the land of his birth, his life, and his death, "native Cornwall^a," as he calls it.

The only addition in this new Edition is the Canticle for Christmas, 1874, the Author's last printed, and amongst the most powerful of his lines.

To satisfy the continuous demand for Mr. Hawker's poetical works this volume has now
