Joseph DeCamp's portrait of Duveneck strongly indicates his physical and mental make-up and harmonizes very well with Mrs. Pennell's description (page 85). The expression of his eyes and hands in the canvas, suggesting a quistude that to the outsider might mean almost anything, yet to those that mow him conveys the feeling of latent power and reminds one that these blue eyes of his are used to look at things firmly and to take from them a clear-cut summary of what is there. The portrait is a double tribute of DeCamp to his teacher. It was a work of love, time having been taken from commissions to complete it for a gift to Cincinnati, where DeCamp was born and received his sarly art training. It also carries the sign of the latter's training under Doveneck. A fine piece of characterisation; the person summed it op who said, "Cut the hand on the left out and show it to anybody that knows Duveneck and he will tell you whose hand it is."
