### A VISIT TO BOSTON, LINCOLNSHIRE

N the eastern part of midland England, extending for a great distance along the shores of the German Ocean, and far inland, is a tract of very flat, low country. Many miles into it reaches

a broad inroad of the sea called The Wash, at the upper end of which is the mouth of a small river, the Witham. Near the junction, it is thought that the Romans built a fortified camp, an outlying defence of their important city, Lindum, since called Lincoln, placed where the ground rises high above the great level. For ages, however, most of these lowlands were a swampy wilderness, forbidding to natives and to foreign invaders; but
