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

INTRODUCTION.

THE subject which is to be discussed in this small volume is one of great extent, great importance, and great difficulty. I shall endeavour so to limit it, by the method of treatment adopted, as to make the views of Creation propounded clear and complete, so far as they go, without attempting or expecting to be able to make them in any sense exhaustive.

Let me commence by a discussion and explanation of the meaning of the word *Creation*.

We are all familiar with the use of the expression as it is to be found in the first sentence of our English Bibles. "In the
