Prefare.

This little volume has been compiled amid great difficulties. So few seemed to care about their heredity it was hard to get the necessary information.

It was begun in 1882, and most of the data was collected very soon after this date. A few facts that have come to my knowledge since have been recorded; but no effort has been made to obtain later records.

The book might have been much more complete if inquiries had been more fully answered. Some would reply only after receiving a second, or a third, or a fourth request; and many would not favor me with any reply.

Mistakes will be found, as there is likely to be in all human productions; but great effort has been put forth to secure accuracy in all these records.
