THE MEXICAN VETERAN PENSION LAW.

- 672

[PUBLIC-No. 33.]

An Aor granting pensions to the soldiers and sailors of the Mexican war, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled. That the Sceretary of the Interior be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to place on the pension-roll the names of the surviving officers and enlisted men, including marines, militia, and volunteers, of the military and naval services of the United States, who, being duly emlisted, actually served sirty days with the Army or Navy of the United States in Maxico, or on the coasts or frontier thereof, or *en route* thereto, in the war with that nation, or were actually engaged in a battle in said war, and were honorably discharged, and to such other officers and soldiers and sallors as may have been personally named in any resolution of Congress for any specific service in said war, and the surviving widow of such officers and anilisted men: *Provided*, That such vidows have not remarried : *Provided*, That avery such officer, enlisted man, or widow who is or may become sixty-two years of ago, or who is or may become subject to any disability or dependency equivalent to some cause prescribed or recognized by the pension laws of the United States as a sufficient reason for the allowance of a pension, shall be entitled to the benefits of this act; but it shall not be bold to include any person not within the rule of age or disability or dependence heroin defined, or who incurred such disability while in any manner voluntarily engaged in or aiding or absting the late rebellion against the authority of the United States.

⁵BO. 2. That penalons under section one of this act shall be at the rate of eight dollars per month, and payable only from and after the passage of this act, for and during the natural lives of the persons entitled thereto, or during the continuance of the disability for which the same shall be granted : *Provided*, That section one of this act shall not apply to any person who is receiving a pension at the rate of sight dollars per month, or more, nor to any person receiving a pension of less than eight dollars per month, except for the difference between the pension now received (if less than eight dollars per month) and eight dollars per month.

SEC. 3. That before the name of any person shall be placed on the pensionroll under this set proof shall be made, under such rules and regulations as the Secretary of the Interior may preservibe, of the right of the applicant to a pension; and any person who shall falsely and corruptly take any oath required under this act shall be deemed guilty of perjury; and the Secretary of the Interior shall cause to be stricken from the pension-roll the name of any person whenever it shall be made to appear by proof satisfactory to bin that such name was put upon such roll through false and fraudulent representations, and that such person is not entitled to a pension under this act. The loss of the certificate of discharge shall not deprive any person of the benefits of this each durther record evidence of enlistment and services and of an honorable discharge may be deemed sufficient : *Provided*, That when any person has been granted a land-warrant, under any act of Congress, for and on account of service in the said war with Merico, such grant shall be priven face evidence of his services and honorable discharge ; but such evidence shall not be conclusive, and may be rebutted by evidence that such land-warrant was improperly granted. SEC. 4. That the pension laws now in force which are not inconsistent or in

SEC. 4. That the pension laws now in force which are not inconsistent or in conflict with this act are hereby made a part of this act, so far as they may be applicable thereto.

Szo. 5. That section forty-seven hundred and sixteen of the Bevised Statutes is hereby repealed so far as the same relates to this act or to pensioners under this act.

SEC. 6. That the provisions of this act shall not apply to any person while under the political disabilities imposed by the fourteenth amendment to the constitution of the United States.
