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Introductory Note

This pamphlet includes the latest official reports of all the national and international Christian student movements embraced in the World's Student Christian Federation. The period covered is the year beginning March 1, 1903, and ending February 29, 1904. A survey of these reports shows that during the year under review there has been substantial and encouraging progress made in the promotion of Christian life and effort among students in all parts of the world. The year has witnessed an increase of over a hundred Christian student organizations and an augmenting of the total membership of the Federation from about ninety thousand to fully one hundred thousand. The internal growth has been equally notable, both in the student movements of the Occident and in those of the Orient.

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List of Questions Sent to the Christian Student Movements of the World*

(Covering the period March 1, 1908, to February 29, 1904.)

1. Give the total number of separate student organizations belonging to your movement; also the total number of members in all these organizations combined.
2. What new pamphlets and leaflets have been published by your movement during the past year?
3. What student conferences have been held during the year, and what was the number of delegates at each?
4. Has your movement been as fruitful during the past year as it was during the preceding year in influencing students to become Christians? If so, what have been the causes? If not, what in your judgment is the explanation?
5. Indicate any advances which have been made by your movement during the year in the promotion of Bible study. What is the total number of students in your movement who have been in Bible classes during the year?
6. What are the most interesting and striking facts showing the development of missionary interest among the members of your movement (such facts, for example, as students offering themselves for foreign service, the study of missions by students, student financial gifts to missions, missionary conferences, work by students to awaken missionary interest among young people, etc.)?
