ADVERTISEMENT.

AT a meeting held on the 28th of March last year (1883), presided over by the Marquis of Lothian, while the assemblage was representative of all interests—scientific, practical, and professional—it was resolved:—'That it is expedient in the interests of forestry, and to promote a movement for the establishment of a National School of Forestry in Scotland, as well as with a view of furthering and stimulating a greater improvement in the scientific management of woods in Scotland and the sister countries which has manifested itself during recent years, that there should be held in Edinburgh, during 1884, and at such season of the year as may be arranged, an International Exhibition of forest products and other objects of interest connected with forestry.'

In an Addendum to Reports made to the Executive Committee by the Jurors selected to award premiums on Forestal Literature, it is stated:

'The following works are exhibited by Dr J. C. Brown:-

Introduction to the Study of Modern Forest Economy,

Forest Lands and Forestry of Northern Russia.

French Forest Ordinance of 1669; with Historical Sketch of Previous Treatment of Forests in France.

Pine Plantations on Sand Wastes in France.

Reboisement in France; or, Records of the Replanting of the Alps, the Cevennes, and the Pyrenees, with Trees, Herbage, and Bush, with a view to arresting and Preventing the destructive consequences of torrents.

Hydrology of South Africa; or, Details of the Former Hydrographic Condition of Cape of Good Hope, and of Causes of its Present Aridity, with Suggestions of Appropriate Remedies for this Aridity.

Water Supply of South Africa, and Facilities for the Storage of it.

Forests and Moisture; or, Effects of Forests on Humidity of Climate.
