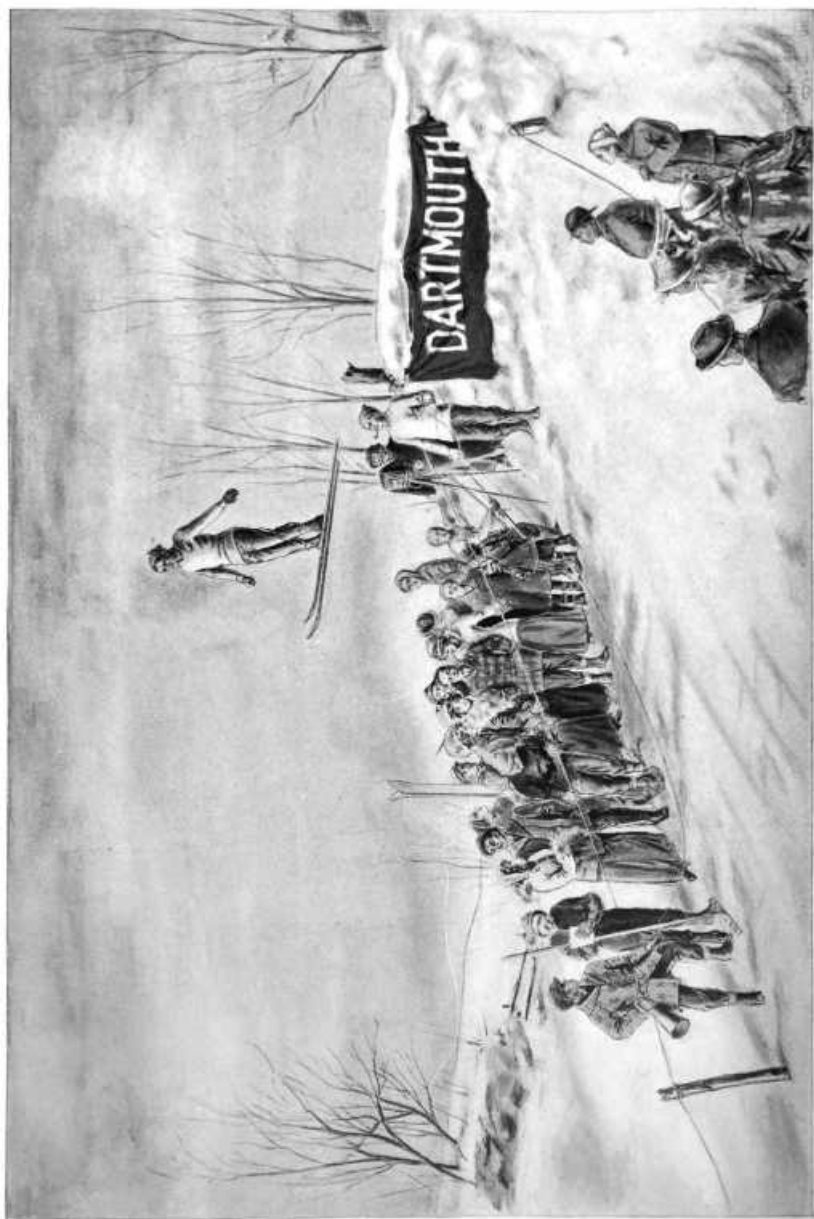

LOCATION

The College is situated on an upland terrace above the Connecticut River in the high hill-country of middle New Hampshire and Vermont.

HISTORY

Founded by royal charter from George III, December 18th, 1769. The charter of the college was an outgrowth of a plan of the Reverend Eleazer Wheelock for the education of Indians which had its first development in the foundation in 1754 of Moor's Indian Charity School at Lebanon, Conn. In 1816 the State of New Hampshire attempted to gain control of the college. The case was fought through the lower courts and finally carried to the Supreme Court of the United States. Mr. Webster in an argument of great eloquence and power presented the case of his Alma Mater. Decision favorable to the college was rendered by Chief Justice Marshall in 1819. This decision in the now famous "Dartmouth College Case" was cast in such broad terms that it has been characterized as "in its effects more far-reaching and of more general interest than perhaps any other decision ever made in this country."

The courses of undergraduate instruction offered by the college lead to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science.

The Associated Graduate Schools:

The Amos Tuck School of Administration and Finance

A school offering two years of special preparation for business careers. Students of three years' undergraduate standing, admitted to the work of the first year which leads to the bachelor's degree.

The work of this year lays a foundation for the specialized work of the second year. Students with the bachelor's degree are admitted to the work of the second year, which leads to the degree of Master of Commercial Science.

The Thayer School of Civil Engineering

Established 1871, offers a general course of study and practice in Civil Engineering, so developed as to include the essential principles of all important branches through two years of professional preparation.

The Medical School

Established 1797. The course covers four years of lectures, laboratory and recitation work, with clinics and ward classes at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial

Hospital. This hospital, widely known as one of the best cottage hospitals in the country, is under the management of physicians and surgeons who are connected with the Medical School.—J. M. GILE, M.D., *Dean*.
