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## GREEK TEST PAPERS.

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### LOWER GRADE.

#### I.

1. Give stem, voc. sing., and acc. pl. of Σκύθης, πατήρ, γένος, λέων, ῥήτωρ, πόλις.

2. Compare αἰσχρὸς, ἄκρατος, μέγας, κακῶς, καλῶς, ἔξω.

3. Give Greek for—21st, 1000, 1000th, 8th, 700, 70, 10,000th.

4. Give Greek equivalents of *deni, uterque, alter, talis, idem, nosmetipsi*.

5. Write 3rd sing. perf. ind. pass. of σπάω, τέμνω, καλέω, πέμπω, τίλλω, φαίνω.

6. Give chief parts of διδάσκω, στέλλω, πείθω, φαίνω, λανθάνω, γαμῶ, and distinguish the meanings of the active and middle voices of these verbs.

7. Make in Greek—

(1) I am too young to marry you (fem.).

(2) They fear they will not die.

(3) If I had killed the dog, I should not now be afraid.

(4) As often as I enter the city, I send you three slaves.

(5) You there, what are you doing?

(6) Would that I were in some other city!
