LOCAL ACTS, 1921.

[No. 1.]

AN ACT to amend section six of act number three hundred sixty-eight of the Local Acts of eighteen hundred ninety-five, entitled "An act to revise, amend and consolidate all acts relative to union school district of the city of Flint."

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

SECTION 1. Section six of act number three hundred sixty-eight of the Local Acts of eighteen hundred ninety-five, entitled "An act to revise, amend and consolidate all acts relative to union school district of the city of Flint," is hereby amended to read as follows: Section amended.

SEC. 6. The said board of trustees shall annually, on or before the first Monday of June in each year, estimate and determine the amount necessary to be raised in addition to the other school funds for the ordinary expenses of the schools in said union school district: *Provided*, That the amount so to be determined shall not in any one year exceed eight-tenths of one per cent of the assessed valuation of the taxable property of said district as last equalized; and previous to the second Monday of June of each year the president and secretary of said board shall make and deliver to each of the supervisors or assessing officers of said city of Flint a certificate in writing signed by them of the amount so determined, and the same shall be levied upon the taxable property of the said union school district, collected and returned at the same time and in the same manner as the taxes for general city purposes. The president and secretary of said board shall in like manner, before the second Monday of October in each year, make to each of said supervisors or assessing officers of the city of Flint, a certificate of the amount necessary to be raised to meet the next maturing installment of principal and interest on the bonded debt of said school district, and also of any sum or sums which may have been voted to be raised at any special meeting of said district for any of the purposes named in this act, and the same, as also the one mill tax, shall be levied upon the taxable property of the said union school district, collected and returned at the same time and in the same manner as the state and county taxes. All such school taxes shall be paid by the collector or collectors thereof directly to the treasurer of said district. Estimate of tax necessary.
Proviso, limit.

Referendum. SEC. 2. This act shall not be in force until a majority of the qualified electors in the union school district of the city of Flint, voting thereon, shall vote in favor of the same. Said proposition shall be submitted to the voters of said district for their approval or disapproval at the annual spring election to be held in the city of Flint, Genesee county, Michigan, on Monday, the fourth day of April, A. D., nineteen-hundred twenty-one. Notice of such election shall be given and all votes on the question shall be taken, counted and canvassed in the same manner as is now required by law for the election of trustees of said district. The vote upon the proposition of amending said local act shall be by ballot which shall be in substantially the following form:

Who to furnish.

Such ballots shall be furnished by the school board of said district and shall be deposited in ballot boxes provided for that purpose. The result of said vote shall be certified to the county clerk of the county of Genesee and to the secretary of state. If a majority of the electors voting upon such proposition shall vote in favor of the amendment of said act number three hundred sixty-eight of the Local Acts of eighteen hundred ninety-five, then this act shall be in full force and effect and not otherwise.

SEC. 3. This act is hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the protection of the public peace, health and safety.

This act is ordered to take immediate effect.

AN ACT to change the name of the village of Gobleville, Van Buren county, to Gobles, upon approval of the electors of such village.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

Name changed.

SECTION 1. The name of the village of Gobleville, Van Buren county, is hereby changed to Gobles.
