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
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# CHASE & STUART'S CLASSICAL SERIES

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THIS book is intended to be complete in itself, and to give the beginner in Latin sufficient exercise in the inflections and the principal rules of syntax. Special vocabularies accompany the exercises, and complete vocabularies of all the words used in them are given at the end of the book.

The usual classification according to stems has been given, but the subject is not enforced. Some use has been made of the base, which, if less philosophical, is far more intelligible to young students.

In the syntax, it was deemed best to make no distinction between clauses of pure purpose and result and substantive clauses of the same character.

The quantity of all syllables not determined by the general rules of quantity is marked in the usual way.

#### PREFACE.

It may be remarked that every Latin phrase or sentence in the book is either taken directly from a Latin author, or is based upon good classical usage.

The Latin Grammar and the Latin Reader of this series are designed to follow immediately the First Latin Book.

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### FIRST LATIN BOOK.

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#### THE ALPHABET.

1. THE Latin alphabet is the same as the English, except that it has no W.

The vowels are a, e, i, o, u, y. The remaining letters are called consonants.

The mutes are b, c, d, g, k, p, q, t.

The liquids are l, m, n, r.

The diphthongs are as, os, au, ei, eu, ui.

Vowels may be long, short, or common; and are thus marked:

long, ā, ē, ī, ō, ū; ahort, ă, ĕ, Ĭ, ŏ, ŭ; common, ā, ĕ, Ĭ, ŏ, ŭ.

a means that the a is sometimes long, and sometimes short.

#### PRONUNCIATION.

2. Three different methods of pronouncing Latin are in use in this country: the Roman or Phonetic, the Continental, and the English.

#### THE ROMAN METHOD.

3. By the Roman method the sound of each letter is always the same.

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
