# PREFACE.

A brief one will probably be best. In reference to the diffidence the author has had in presenting this work to the public, the want of talent, and the fear-that the events of his life might not be of sufficient interest to warrant a publication, were the principal reasons for his unwillingness. The rough sketch which he drew up, however, was shown to a gentleman whose standing in the literary world gives weight to his opinion, and whose name is withheld only lest his credit should suffer by encouraging so poor a performance; he recommended to the author to proceed.
