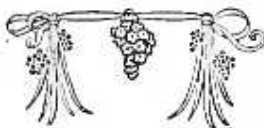

To the Class:

Now that the volume of our achievements is ready to be bound between its final covers, I wish to say a few words in connection with its creation, and in explanation of its contents.

It has taken from August of 1902 to the present time to garner the material for this report, but the showing, on the whole, is a good one, 600 men out of a total of 666 having replied in some form to the official appeals.

The slow growth of the report has made it impossible to have every statement up to date, and some addresses may not be all that fancy paints them; but the primary effort has been to procure as much exact information about as many men as possible, as a matter of permanent record as well as of present human interest. The replies sent in have had to be edited in order to group the information into an orderly scheme, and if any man is misquoted or misconstrued the Secretary asks his charitable judgment.

In the body of the report no distinction has been made between regular and temporary members, such separation being confined to the introductory list. As time goes on the chief distinction which will survive in the reports will be between those who do answer the Secretary's notices and those who do not. A list of "Lost Men" has been included in the report, and about these men any information, particularly their addresses, will be very welcome; and all men are urged to send the Secretary copies of wedding announcements, newspaper clippings, and other news matter of interest or moment, bearing upon themselves or upon other classmates.

The statements about deceased members of the class contain only a brief historical outline, as it was found impossible to include expressions of eulogy in a simple record of this nature.

I wish to express my personal thanks to the many men who have responded with promptness and cordiality to my importunate requests. Their number is steadily growing, as is the appreciation of the meaning and the value of our permanent association.
