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#### PREFACE.

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In a first-book for beginners and young children, formal grammatical rules and all technicalities should be avoided.

The arrangement ought to be methodical and very plain, and designed to teach the *elements* rather than the *philosophy* of the language.

It was under this impression that we wrote the present little work, the success of which has exceeded our expectations.

It has now been entirely revised, enlarged, and stereotyped; but the original plan has not been changed.

Part 1st contains a few spelling-lessons, enough to enable the scholar to overcome some of the difficulties of spelling and pronunciation. With re

gard, however, to pronunciation, it is our opinion that *practice in speaking* is not only better than written rules, but is absolutely essential.

Parts 2d and 3d might easily have been extend ed, but with the aid of a competent teacher they are believed to be sufficient to enable the learner in a short time to acquire a knowledge of the rudiments of conversation and of French grammar.

Part 4th contains Examples of French Verbs, auxiliary, regular, and reflective, fully conjugated.

Part 5th is composed of a few simple Stories, the first few followed by a Translation of the more difficult Words and Idioms.

Part 6th will be used as an introduction to our *Easy Conversations in French*, and will give variety to the exercises.
