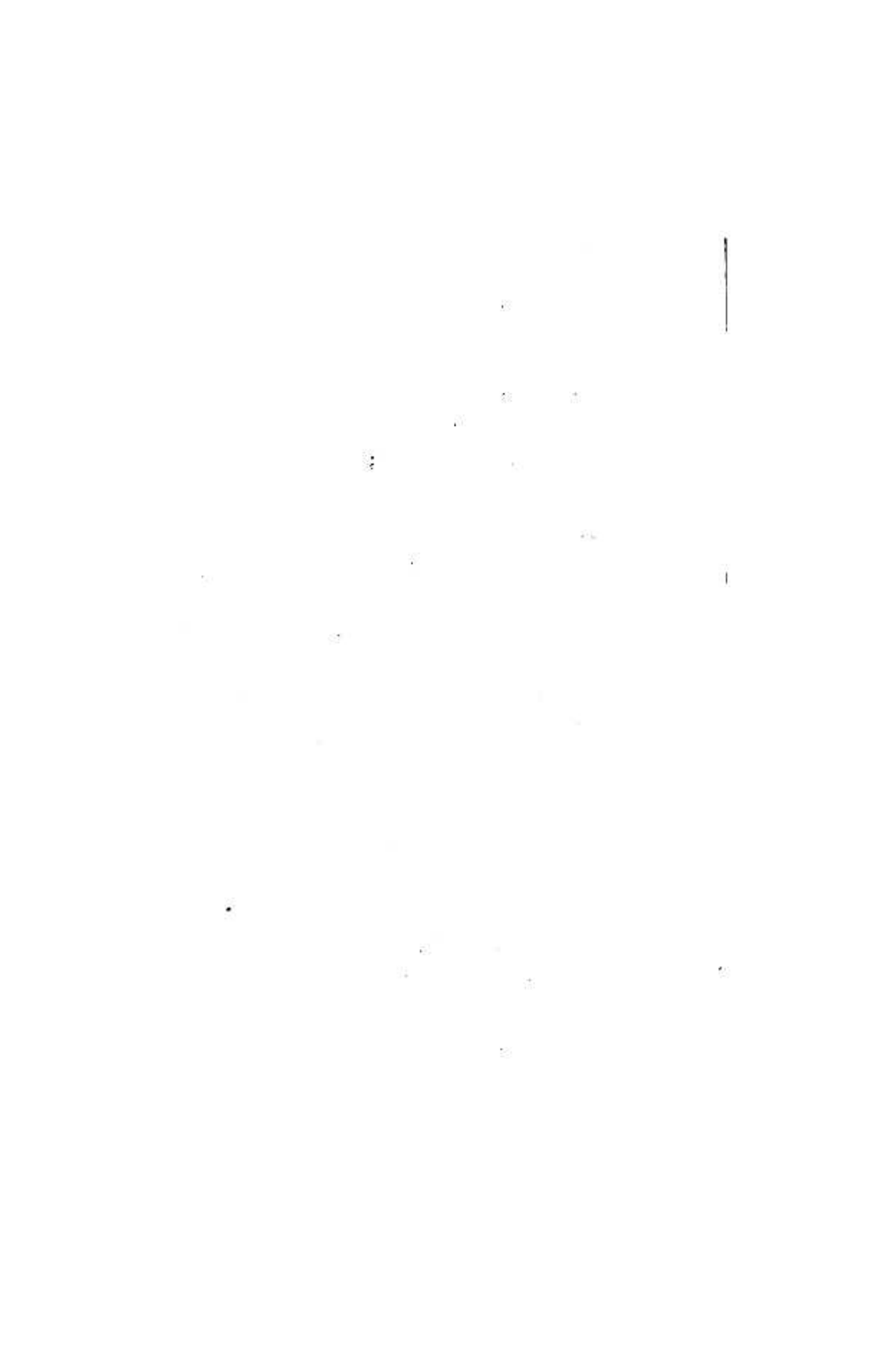

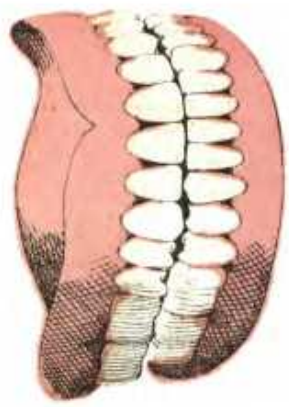

DESCRIPTION OF COLORED DRAWINGS.

- No. 1. A complete set of Incorrodible Composition Teeth, which will never discolor or decay, set in the soft Flexible Coralite Gums. This will be found the greatest improvement ever made in Dentistry; and at the same time, *less expensive* than any other method.
- No. 2. A partial upper set of Incorrodible Teeth, on Flexible Coralite Gums, sustained entirely by *self-adhesion*, without springs, wires, or ligatures.
- No. 3. A partial *lower* set of the same Teeth, set in the Flexible Coralite Gums. This invention, from the softness and flexibility of the material employed, and all sharp edges being avoided, is the most valuable discovery ever made for the lower sets of teeth.
- No. 4. A small piece of four upper Teeth on Flexible Coralite Gums, kept firm in the mouth by self-adhesion, without wires or ligatures.
- No. 5. A second partial upper set of ten Artificial Teeth, set in the Patent Flexible Coralite Gums, kept up by self-adhesion.

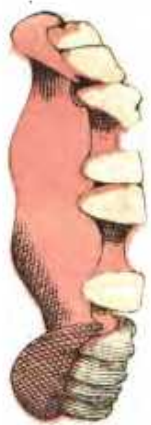
