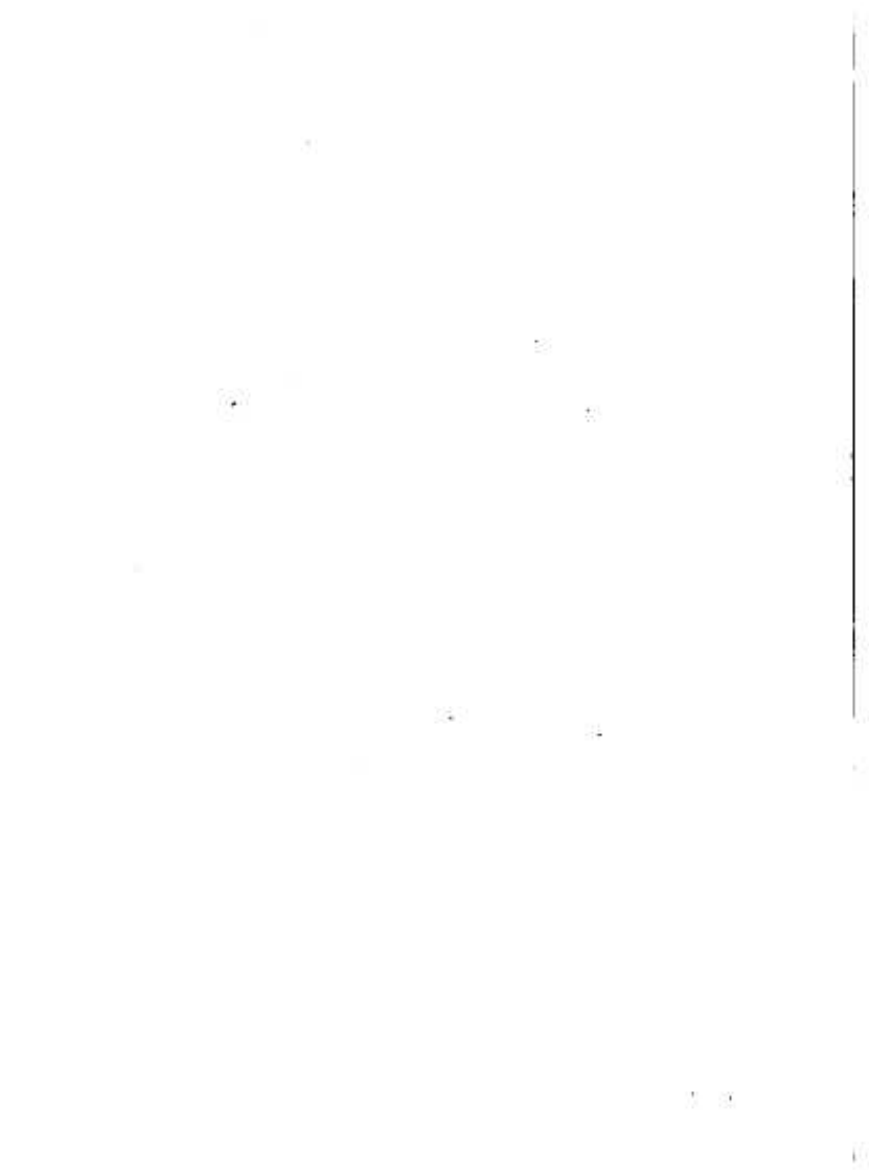


Figure 1. Distribution of the number of clusters for different sample sizes and correlation coefficients.
