To the Honorable the General Assembly:

GENTLEMEN:—The Seventeenth Annual Report upon the Registration of Births, Marriages and Deaths in Rhode Island, is herewith presented.

This report has been prepared by Dr. Edward T. Caswell, and presents the vital statistics for the year ending December 31st, 1869, with the usual recapitulatory tables, and with additional comments.

The number of births for that year was 5,245, or 127 less than in 1868; the number of marriages was 2,289, or 4 more than in 1868; and the number of deaths was 3,882, or 470 more than in 1868, and more than in any year since the publication of these reports.

During the seventeen years and six months since the commencement of the present system of registration, i. e., from June 1, 1852, to December 31, 1869, the records in the whole State have been as follows: Children born, 69,390; persons married, 58,434; persons died, 45,054, showing in the aggregate, a record of the birth, marriage or death of 172,878 persons.

In this report will be found for the first time the returns of Divorces authorized by the law of 1868. Many imperfections in the law have been shown in a subsequent page of this report; others will probably suggest themselves to your honorable body. It is to be hoped that the law may be so amended as to remove the defects now existing in it. The number of divorce suits disposed of in the State for the year 1869, was 185.

The returns are, on the whole, very complete, but there are some instances of glaring omissions, to which attention must be called. Thus some of the towns in Providence county maintain an unenviable notoriety in deficient returns. In Cumberland, 55 deaths were reported, and in no instance was the cause of death assigned. In Pawtucket, 97 deaths were reported, and the cause of death was given in about one-tenth only. In Scituate the return of deaths came in, with the cause of death entirely blank; subsequently the cause of a majority of these deaths was filled according to the knowledge and recollection of the selectmen,-evidently a very poor substitute for the physician's certificate required by the law. Such gross neglect is worthy of severe censure. The law states that the town clerks are "authorized and required" to collect these returns in due form. This duty is often delegated to incompetent persons, and in this way the returns are made less complete. There is another point in which many of the town clerks are derelict, and that is the time at which the returns shall be forwarded to this office. The law requires that they shall be forwarded "on or before the first Monday of March annually." It is to be hoped that the members of your honorable body will interest themselves in their several districts to see that the provisions of the Registration law are more faithfully carried out, since the value of these reports depends upon the fulness and completeness of the returns.
