DENVER, COLO., August 10, 1899-10 a. m.

The convention was called to order by Hon. CICERO J. LINDLY, chairman.

CALL FOR NATIONAL CONVENTION OF BAILBOAD COMMISSIONERS.

By authority of the national convention of railroad commissioners, held at Washington, D. C., on the 10th and 11th days of May, 1898, and pursuant to vote thereof fixing the time and place for the next annual meeting, notice is hereby given that the Eleventh Annual Convention of Railroad Commissioners will be held at Brown Palace Hotel, in the city of Denver, Colo., on Thursday, August 10, 1899, at 11 o'clock a. m. The railroad commissioners of all States, and State officers charged

with any duty in the supervision of railroads, are respectfully requested to attend and participate in the discussion of such topics as may come before the convention.
