

### I.

HAT all poor perfons, fingle or married, without families, who are unable to maintain themfelves, be taken into the houfe, and not fupported out of it by any fettled allowance or penfion.

### II.

That all poor perfons, whole families are too large to be maintained by their own labour, may offer one or more of their children to be received into the houfe, at the difcretion of the weekly committee.

### III.

That orders for admiffion into the houfe be made by a committee only; except in cafualties, or fudden illnefs fubfequent to the laft committee, when an immediate admittance may be neceffary: in fuch cafes (and in fuch only), two directors, or acting guardians, may give an order for the fame on any other day; as may the furgeon alone, in cafes which happen in the night; with the further exception, that perfons fent by order of removal, or by a vagrant pafs, be immediately received, without any other authority; but that the perfons thus admitted be reported to the next committee.

#### IV.

ł

That poor perfons received into the houfe, for temporary relief only, fhall not be deprived of their houfhold goods, furniture or other property. But fuch wearing apparel, and other goods, as any pauper may bring into the houfe, fhall be deemed and taken to be the property of the guardians of the poor, during the time fuch perfon fhall be maintained in the houfe.

### · v.

That penfions may be granted by a quarterly meeting—but in extraordinary cafes only; fuch as blindnefs, lunacy, epilepfy, and the like; in which, admiffion into the houfe may be judged improper; provided, that an examination be previoufly taken on oath, respecting the place of the [5]

the pauper's fettlement, and the inability of himfelf, and fuch of his relations as are compellable by law to maintain him: provided alfo, that nothing herein contained be confirued to make void any penfion already granted; but that the fame be continued and renewed, unlefs fuch penfioners appear, on a fimilar examination, to be improper objects of relief from any parifh within the ifland.

### VI.

That a weekly committee may grant to the use of any poor labourer's wife, on the birth of a fourth, fifth, or fixth child, the respective sums of five shillings, seven shillings and sixpence, or ten shillings and sixpence, according as he may then have living, sour, sive, or six children, under sourcen years of age; but, that five shillings thereof be applied, by the overseer, to the payment of the midwife.

### VII.

That one churchwarden, or overfeer of the poor, of every parifh, be obliged to apply to the weekly committee on every fitting, either in perfon, or by a director, or acting guardian, and to report (after due enquiry made by himfelf, at the refpective dwellings of the poor) the number and ages of the family, and other circumflances, including the place of fettlement, as well as the illnefs of all perfons in his parifh, who may afk for, and ftand in need of, relief, under the penalty of any fum, not lefs than forty fhillings and not

not exceeding five pounds, as directed by the act; but that relief may be granted to any pauper, who may be in the fame manner reported by the furgeon, a director, or acting guardian.

#### VIIL

That in cafe of an application wherein the preceding regulation hath not been adhered to, the committee, if it fee proper, may entruft a director, or acting guardian, or the furgeon, with an order of relief, to be delivered, or not, to the pauper, according as the perfon, thus entrufted, may find the circumflances of the cafe; or the committee may order the furgeon, or parifh-officer, to vifit the faid pauper, and to make a report, as before required, to the next committee, which may then give relief from the time of the firft application.

### . IX.

That when any poor perfon, by cafualty, or fudden illnefs, fubfequent to the laft holden committee, may fland in need of immediate rehief, before application can be made to the next enfuing; a director, or acting guardian, on the knowledge of the fact and neceffity of the cafe, may recommend fuch perfon to the care of the furgeon, (which may likewife be done in all cafes of ficknefs among the poor, though no pecuniary relief be applied for) and may, where neceffary, order, in writing, a reafonable fum, not exceeding the ufual earnings of the fick perfon, after the rate of one fhilling a day for a man, and

fo for others in proportion, as a temporary fupport till the next weekly committee; to which the overfeer of the refpective parifh muft in perfon report the circumftances, and receive directions for the farther relief of the pauper; and (to be entitled to the allowance of the fum ordered on the fettling of his accounts) muft, at the fame time, return the faid order for confirmation, by being figned by the chairman.

### X.

That all cafual poor, relieved by the order of a director, or acting guardian, fhall, on the report of the furgeon at the next weekly committee, be ordered into the houfe, or relieved out of it, as fhall appear expedient for the health of the patient.

### XI.

That the weekly committee, on application of an overfeer, may grant monthly relief out of the houfe to the families of men imprefied into the fea-fervice, during their continuance as impreffed men, not exceeding the fum of one fhilling and fixpence a week, for two children under the age of ten years; the fum of two fhillings a week, for three fuch children; and the fum of three fhillings a week, for four fuch; to be paid weekly by the respective overfeers, who are required to ftop payment on the death or difcharge of any fuch man, and report the flate of the family to the next weekly committee; and that this proportion of relief be adopted in all fimilar cafes. ### XII.

That when it fhall appear to a weekly committee that labour in hufbandry cannot be obtained at the ufual wages, on account of a general exifting fcarcity of work, the committee may order any reafonable fum, not exceeding one fourth of the real earnings of fuch labourers, employed by its confent, to be paid by overfeers to the different perfons employing them, fo that fuch earnings do not exceed fix fhillings a week for each man, and fo in proportion for others. And when fuch earnings do neceffarily fall fhort of fix fhillings a week, merely on account of the unfeafonablenefs of the weather (as in deep fnow or hard frofts), the deficiency may be made up to that fum, for a man who has a family to maintain:

# XIII.

That a fum, not exceeding ten pounds in any one year, be laid out in purchafing fpinningwheels, cards, and fuch like implements of work, for the use of the industrious poor women and children; which, after being marked "HOUSE OF INDUSTRY," may be lent or given them, at the diferention of the weekly committee; and that work in fpinning, knitting, &c. fhall be supplied from the house, by an order from the faid committee, to all perfons of the above defeription, who may not be able to procure any such work elfewhere.

XIV. That
