PREFATORY NOTE.

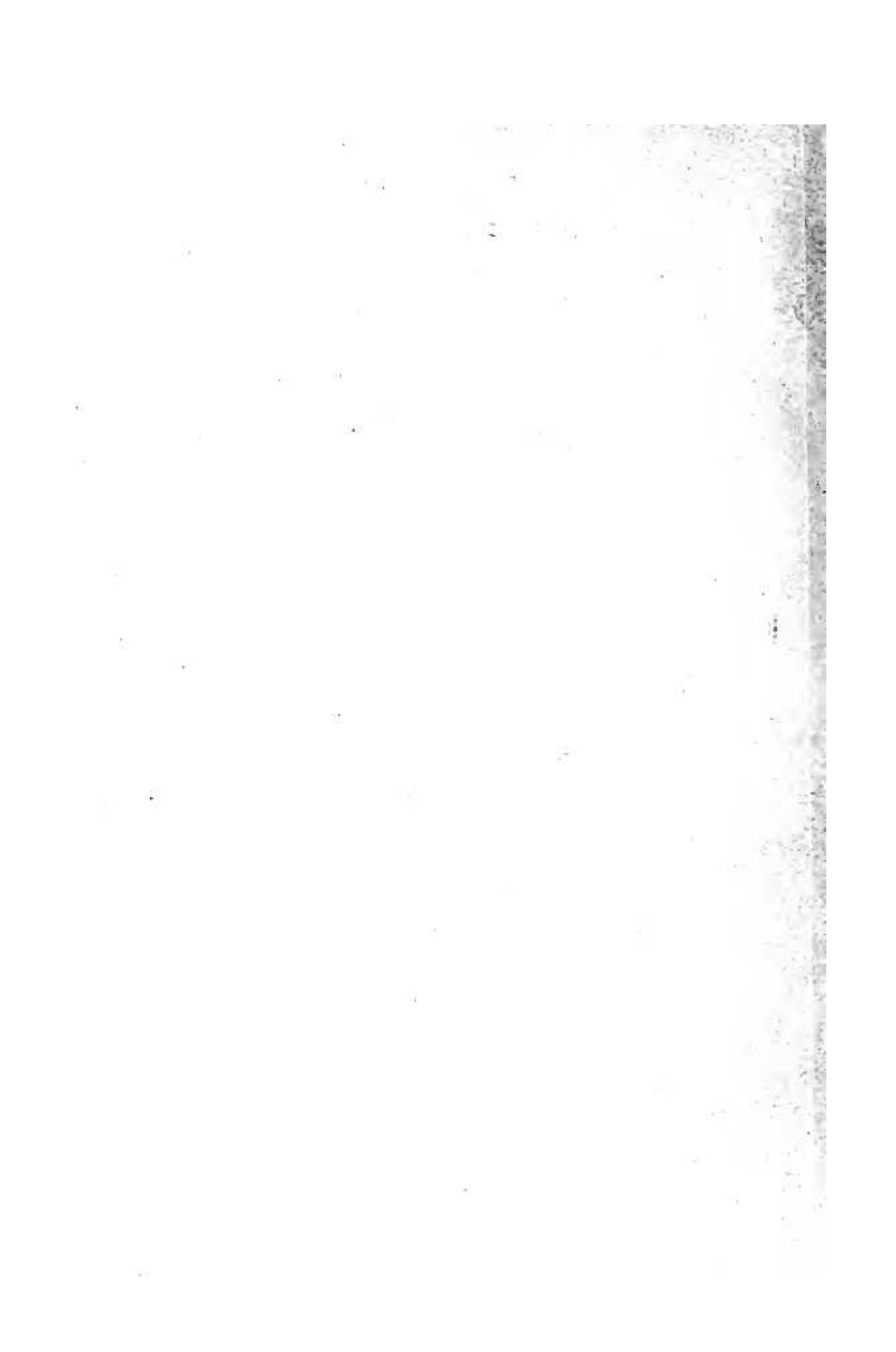
