PREFACE

THE Gynæcological Society of Boston was founded Jan. 22d, 1869, and is the first gynæcological society that was ever formed. It originally consisted of only eight members. The work undertaken was most important in its relation to the treatment of disease peculiar to women, and it has been eminently successful in stimulating the spirit for investigation into the causes of disease, and for the development and the adoption of surgical methods and procedures that have proved everywhere appropriate and successful in their results, not only in cases strictly gynæcological but in those pertaining to every other department coming under the surgeon's care.

A careful perusal of the first seven volumes of the Transactions, 1869–1872, shows that the work that was begun has been monumental in its results as does also that of the volume that appeared in 1889, besides the fact that there have been presented many able papers which have been read at various times, and the discussions that have been carried on both before and subsequent to this last date. The matters comprised within this publication are for the most part taken from the records of the secretary, and therefore any errors that may appear in the record of the discussions should be attributed to the seemingly difficult task of always interpreting correctly the expression of a speaker, especially when the remarks are presented in an extemporaneous manner.

It deserves to be mentioned that the society bears upon its rolls besides its Active Members, upwards of one hundred Honorary and fully six hundred Corresponding Members who have been distinguished in their respective departments of practice, and have been resident in the United States, in Canada, and in the European countries.
