That on and after the first day of Angust, eighteen hundred and That on and after the hest may of August, express innurves and ninety-four, unless otherwise specially provided for in this Act, there shall be levied, collected, and paid upon all articles imported from for-eign countries or withdrawn for consumption, and mentioned in the schedules herein contained, the rates of duty which are, by the schedules and paragraphs, respectively prescribed, namely:
