### HON. PATRICK A. COLLINS,

Mayor of the City of Boston:

SIR, — The Board of Street Commissioners presents the following as the report of the Street Laying-Out Department, including a statement relating to public lands in its care, for the year ending January 31, 1905:

Under the orders for laying out, widening, and extending streets, passed by the Board during the year, land to the amount of 37,634 square feet was taken for street purposes. Streets having a total length of 3,311 feet were made public ways. Under authority of the acts of the Legislature, for the assessment upon abutting property of the benefit derived by it from the laying out and construction of streets, there has been assessed upon twenty-five streets a total of \$127,703.88 and upon five public alleys a total of \$8,134.86. For benefits of sewerage works assessments to the amount of \$165,423.36 have been made. The total of benefits assessed for streets, public alleys and sewerage works during the year is the sum of \$301,261.60.

The Board has issued twelve orders of notice of intention to lay out, wideu, relocate, extend, and discontinue streets or parts of streets calling for public hearings. It has considered ten petitions for street improvements. In the settlement of damages for takings of land, etc., for various changes in the city's streets, 82 cases have been acted upon. Claims for damages for sewers and surface drains ordered have been settled to the number of twenty-four. Under authority of the act empowering the Board to apportion assessments on parts of a divided lot, sixty-five assessments have been apportioned.

Under the provisions of the acts of the Legislature giving the Street Commissioners authority to take land for and order the construction of sewerage works, orders have been passed for the improvement and relocation of various natural streams or watercourses, and surface drainage has been supplied for territories needing it, as follows:

East Boston — taking in private land from Bennington street, opposite Blackinton street. Dorchester — Stony brook, from Morton street to Blue Hill avenue, and from Blue Hill avenue to Callender street at Don street; surface drainage between Geneva avenue and Wilder street. West Roxbury — surface drainage from Ashland street to Gilman street; Neponset avenue branch of Stony brook in Hammatt road and Hadwinway, and land between said ways; Roslindale branch of Stony brook, small taking in . private land off Sycamore street.

Takings have been made for and sewers ordered built in the following private ways: Lovering place, from Washington street to Harrison avenue. South Boston - Kemp street, from Columbia road to Washington avenue. Roxbury ----Darling street, Iroquois street and Wyoming street, from Humboldt avenue to Wabeno street. East Boston - Frankfort street, from the Parkway to Prescott street, and from the Parkway to Swift street; Marion street, from Bremen street to Orleans street; Prescott street, from Bromen street to Frankfort street, and from Frankfort street to Cleveland Dorchester --- Beaumont street for 700 feet northstreet. easterly from Carroth street; Clapp place, from Roseclair street; Englewood street, from Hillside street to Parkview street; Field's court, from Willow court; Hillsdale street, from Adams street to beyond Richview street, and for about 800 feet from Codman street; Richview street, from Hillsdale street to Parkview street. Brighton - Allston place; Cummings road, near Commonwealth avenue; Parkman street, from Brooks street; Stratton street, from Bigelow street to near Atkins street. West Roxbury - Abbott street, from Willow street; Addington road, from Weld street to Dunbar street; Dunbar street, at Westover street, and from Westover street to Walker street; Montello street, from Colberg avenue to Belgrade avenue; Mozart street for 180 feet northeast from Walter street and Rowe street.

An additional easement for sewerage purposes was purchased through private land on Shepard street, Brighton.

An order was passed for the relocation of Newman street, South Boston, from Dorchester street to Champney street extended.

#### CHANGES IN STREET NAMES.

An order passed by the Board February 8, 1904, changing the name of Roseland street to Keswick street, was confirmed by the Board of Aldermen February 15, 1904.

An order passed by the Board February 8, 1904, changing the name of Devens street and the name of Bow street, Charlestown, to Rutherford avenue, was confirmed by the Board of Aldermen February 15, 1904.

An order passed by the Board February 8, 1904, changing the name of a part of Walley street, East Boston, to Bennington street, was confirmed by the Board of Aldermen February 15, 1904.

An order passed by the Board February 8, 1904, changing a part of the name of Walley street, East Boston, to Ashley street, was confirmed by the Board of Aldermen February 15, 1904.

An order passed by the Board February 8, 1904, changing the name of Turner street to Bickerstaff street, was confirmed by the Board of Aldermen February 15, 1905.

Under the provisions of the law governing the change of names of streets, these changes will go into effect March 1, 1905.

#### AUTHORITY TO OPEN NEW STREETS.

Acting under the provisions of chapter 323 of the Acts of the Legislature of 1891, and acts in amendment thereof, the Board of Street Commissioners has during the past year given permission to the landowners to open the following private ways:

#### East Boston.

Nay street, easterly from Meridian street for about five hundred twenty-five feet.

#### Roxbury.

Ulmer street, from Arklow street to Centre street.

#### Dorchester.

Doris street, from Dorchester avenue to Gardner street. Quincefield street, from Humphreys street to Wendover street.

#### West Roxbury.

Asticou road, from Walk Hill street to South street. Chocorua street, southwesterly from Walk Hill street, for a distance of about one hundred ninety feet.
