# PREFACE.

THE late George Storer Mansfield, Esq., who resided many years near Derby, accumulated considerable property, which, in purpose, he bequeathed to his two sisters, Mrs. Glover, and Miss Mansfield. ladies were more concerned to see their brother a man of piety, than to become possessed of his wealth. They agreed to offer the prayer of faith in his behalf, and that prayer they lived to see fully answered, so that the practical disregard of religion, which they had long deplored in their relative, was followed by a habit of enlightened and fervent devotedness to the service of God. Soon after this change, Mr. Mansfield, with the cheerful concurrence of his sisters, appropriated the whole of his estates, and some other property, to establish a college, in which young men of piety and talent might receive education preparatory to the Christian ministry.
