PREFACE

GEORGE ALEXANDER WHEELOCK was born in 1816, and has passed his life in Keene, N. H. He graduated from Harvard College in the class of 1836. He has never married, but lived for many years in the family of his sister, Mrs. John Henry Elliot, and later in the family of his nephew, William H. Elliot, in the house on Main Street which is referred to in the poem called the "Large, Yellow House." The "Golden Wedding" was that of Mr. and Mrs. John Elliot, grandparents of W. H. Elliot, which took place in the same house about fifty years ago.

Mr. Wheelock has spent his life in the study of natural history, geology, and botany, and has thoroughly explored the region of Cheshire County. He was for many years chairman of the School Committee of Keene, and has always taken a great interest in the schools, teachers, and individual scholars.

"Thanksgiving Day" refers to the marriage of his niece, Emily Elliot (now Mrs. Tucker Daland), and her trip abroad.
